Call for papers

Deadline for abstract submission 2 December 2009

The organising committee invites abstracts on original unpublished work on any of the conference's four themes. Successful authors will be offered either a platform (oral) presentation or a poster presentation.

Requirements for abstract submission

Abstracts must be 300 words in length and include: background, research question, methodology, findings and conclusions. The text should be submitted in MS Word format with a cover page showing the title of the paper, affiliation and contact details (full address and e-mail) of the corresponding author. No author information should be included on the following page of the abstract. Further guidelines for the submission of papers and posters will be sent upon their acceptance.

Acceptance Process

- Abstracts should be submitted by 2 December 2009. They will be blind reviewed by two members of the scientific committee. Acceptances will be notified before 2 January 2010.
- Authors of accepted abstracts will either be invited to submit a full paper (maximum 5000 words) based on the reviewers' comments or a poster.
- Papers should be submitted by 2 March 2010. They will be blind reviewed by two members of the scientific committee. Acceptances will be notified before 2 May 2010.
- A final version of papers accepted for oral or poster presentation must be submitted by 2 June 2010. At least one of the authors is expected to register for and attend the conference.
